

## **ATTENTION ALL VOTERS — IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE AUGUST FEDERAL ELECTION**

Do not be fooled — there is a Party that does not share our values of freedom and opportunity in Australia, its THE GREENS.

The truth is the Greens political party is an extreme left-wing party that pretends to be environmentalist. They are the most ideologically driven and successful extremist left-wing party with elected representation in Australia.

Did you know that:-

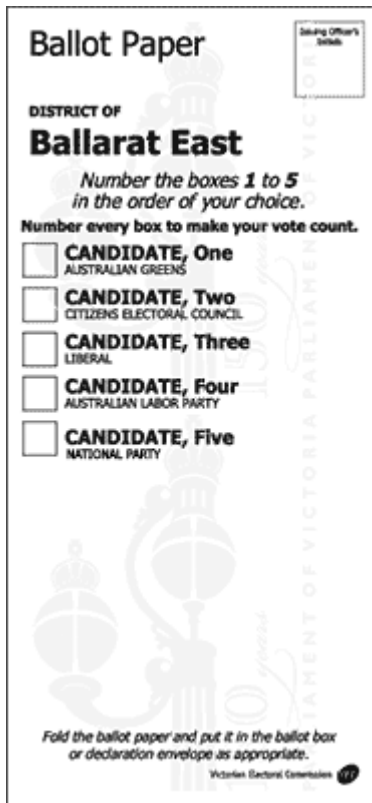
- The Greens are against meat consumption.
- The Greens policies are anti-enterprise.
- The Greens are economically irresponsible.
- The Greens are in favour of establishing shooting galleries for drug addicts.
- The Greens want to pay criminals serving jail sentences the minimum wage.
- The Greens will make the cost of living prohibitive by imposing severe carbon taxes.
- The Greens extremist National Parks **policy helped prevent responsible forest management** policies. The end result was Black February — the worst bushfires in living memory.

You may say that “I won’t vote GREENS, I always vote Labor and follow their **How to Vote Card.**” Or “I always vote for the Liberals and use their **How to Vote Card.**” Don’t be fooled, voting the party card will not necessarily mean that your vote cannot go to the GREEN candidate. Both Labor and the Liberals can and do make deals with the GREENS, which may see your vote electing a Green candidate.

**But there is a way to be sure that your vote does not end up electing a GREENS candidate. Follow the example below.**

**In the lower House you will cast your vote on the small ballot paper. This determines who will form the government**

Example:



**Step 1.**  
Identify the GREENS candidate

**Step 2.**  
Place the GREENS candidate last on the ballot. Using the example to the left, the GREENS candidate is One on the ballot then because in this example there are five candidates in total, put the number five against candidate One.

**Step 3**  
Vote for the remaining candidates according to your preferences.  
As an example if you want to vote for the labor party you would place the number one against the labor candidate and the number four against the liberal candidate, and so on until you have placed a number against each candidate.

**NOTE:**  
Be sure to place a number against all candidates listed, otherwise your vote will be informal

**VOTE THE GREENS CANDIDATE LAST BEFORE YOU VOTE FOR ANYONE ELSE TO AVOID ANY ERRORS**

Remember in the Lower House vote for the government of your choice but;

# **PUT THE GREENS LAST.**

**In the Upper House (The Senate) you have two choices**

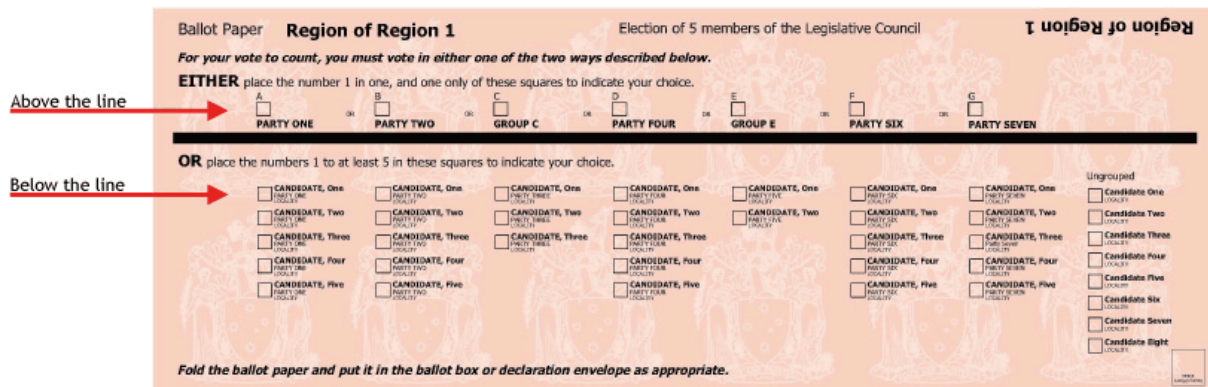
When you vote for your upper house representatives you have a choice of voting above the line or below the line. Your Upper house vote is cast on the large ballot paper, which is divided into two sections. If you vote above the line (this is the quickest method) then place the number 1 against the Shooters and Fishers Party square. DO NOT NUMBER ANY OTHER SQUARE. This will ensure that your vote is distributed to politicians that are fair minded and sensible.

**WHEN VOTING ABOVE THE LINE LOOK FOR THE “SHOOTERS AND FISHERS” GROUP AND JUST PUT “1” ONLY ABOVE THE LINE. That is all you need to do to ensure that THE GREENS do not get your vote.**

If you want to vote below the line (this is more difficult) then you must number every square below the line.

When voting below the line identify the GREENS candidates and make sure that they are numbered last.

The sample ballot paper shown below illustrates the difference between voting above and below the line.



WHEN VOTING BELOW THE LINE YOU MUST IDENTIFY THE GREENS CANDIDATES. THEY WILL APPEAR UNDER THE GREENS COLUMN.

NEXT DETERMINE THE NUMBER OF TOTAL CANDIDATES

NOW PLACE THE GREENS CANDIDATES LAST BY GIVING THEM THE HIGHEST NUMBERS. — IF FOR EXAMPLE THERE ARE 80 CANDIDATES IN TOTAL, START FROM 80 AND COUNT BACK

THEN VOTE FOR THE REMAINING CANDIDATES ACCORDING TO YOUR PREFERENCES.

**REMEMBER TO PUT THE GREENS LAST**
